## Cleaning copper-

Your tools are made of copper, which can tarnish.

This naturally occurring "Patina" can be removed with a solution of Vinegar and Salt.

Simply dip for a few seconds and rinse.

## The patina does not affect the energetics of the tools, and cleaning them is for aesthetic purposes only.

To shine the tools back to new, you can use fine grade **"steel wool"**, found at your local hardware store. **Use caution, and gloves,** when handling steel wool. We recommend using steel wool in the outdoors, taking care to **not breath in the dust particles**
